Getting Through The Year: Ometz Lev: A Courageous Heart with Shirah Bell

Tuesday, 9/14 from 7:00-8:00 pm

We usually start out in the high holidays with high commitment to right our ways, to take on challenges in our lives. But what happens during the year? We often falter. In this class we'll study Ometz Lev (spiritual courage), as contrasted to the physical bravery we usually think of when we define "courage."

Using Cheshbon Hanefesh and the Al Chet (missing the mark) prayer, which we say many times during Yom Kippur, we'll identify opportunities to develop a courageous heart which can support us during the year. Then, each of us will pick one or more middot (soul traits such as humility, trust, compassion, and responsibility) that appear to be significant opportunities for transforming ourselves and begin this year's work of revealing our holiness. **Advance preparation advisable** – email
