On the eve of Yom HaZikaron, Israeli Day of Remembrance, Marsha Malkin will lead us in discussing Women of the Wall (WOW), a group of women who have asserted women's right to pray at the western wall in Jerusalem. They have struggled against personal violence and public opposition since 1988. How does this group and public reaction to it relate to women's rights in Israel and to the history of patriarchy in Judaism?

Marsha Malkin is a retired public health nurse, member of Beth Shalom Synagogue and grandma of two girls and a boy. She sees the WOW movement as symbolic of inequalities of women in Israeli society and the struggle for a pluralistic society within the country. To quote Anat Hoffman, a founder of WOW, in Hebrew there is no word for pluralism.
